May 28, 2010 - Kentucky American Water Plant Tour

After 20 years of rigorous research, study and regional debate, Kentucky American Water identified a solution for solving Central Kentucky's water supply shortfall and is currently building it today: a new 20-million-gallon-per-day water treatment plant on the Kentucky River's Pool 3, a three-million-gallon water storage tank, a booster pump station and a 31-mile, 42-inch underground pipeline connecting the treatment plant to the company's existing distribution system in Fayette County. This additional source of water will augment the company's existing sources of supply to ensure that Central Kentucky's current and future water supply needs are met.

This tour will be a joint meet with KSPE and ASCE with a short business meeting starting at noon. We will meet at Kentucky American Water, 2300 Richmond Road office with box lunch being provided at \$10 per person. The bus will leave the parking lot at 12:45 and will return to Lexington at approximately 4:45. The bus only holds 50 passengers so the first 50 to sign up will be riding the bus.

ASCE's Report Card

A growing topic of discussion in today's society is infrastructure revitalization. As projects to upgrade roads, bridges water treatment plants and other infrastructure get underway the current state of our infrastructure is discussed more and more. As Civil Engineers we have an opportunity to educate the public (and politicians) on the importance of investing in our infrastructure now, not only to maintain our current level of service, but to allow for sustainable growth of our state.

We are seeking volunteers to update the 2003 Infrastructure Report Card for Kentucky. We would follow the format of other ASCE report cards. The topic areas to be covered are as listed below. We will use the ASCE guidelines to develop this report card.

Aviation, Bridges, Dams, Drinking Water, Energy, Hazardous Waste, Navigable Waterways, Public Parks and Recreation, Rail, Roads, Schools, Security, Solid, Waste, Transit, Wastewater, Levees, Inland Waterways and Parks.

We are seeking two volunteers per topic to assure everyone on the study team that the load will not be carried alone. This is an important effort that will allow the state of Kentucky to update our report card and determine if progress has been made. The effort will last approximately 12 months and consist of gathering data on the assigned topic, compiling the data, compare the data to set metrics and assigning a grade. However, the project is scheduled to be complete this calendar year.
